

Article 100 Conflict of Interest Code

Sec. 100.1 Political Reform Act. The Political Reform Act of 1974 (Government Code Section 81000, et seq.) requires each state and local government agency to adopt and promulgate a conflict of interest code. The Valley Center Municipal Water District has heretofore adopted such a code.

Sec. 100.2 Adoption of Standard Code of Fair Political Practices Commission. This code shall take effect when approved by the San Diego County Board of Supervisors and shall thereupon supersede all prior codes adopted by the Valley Center Municipal Water District.

Sec. 100.3 Filing of Statements of Economic Interests/Officials Who Manage Public Investments. All District officials who manage public investments are included in and governed by the Conflict of Interest Code only with respect to its disqualification provisions. For purposes of disclosure, District officials who manage public investments are subject to the statutory conflict of interest provisions of The Political Reform Act of 1974 and must file Form 700, Statements of Economic Interests. It has been determined that the positions listed below are officials who manage public investments:

Members of the Board of Directors
Director of Finance
General Manager
Investment Consultant

Upon receipt of the statements of Members of the Board of Directors and of the General Manager, the secretary shall forward the originals of these statements to the Clerk of the San Diego County Board of Supervisors.

Sec. 100.4 Filing of Statements of Economic Interests/Designated Employees. Designated employees set forth in the appendix of the District's Conflict of Interest Code shall file Statements of Economic Interests with the Secretary of the Valley Center Municipal Water District. Such Statements shall be retained by the Valley Center Municipal Water District for seven years as required by Government Code Section 81009.
